- Consider spending some time listening to intimate worship music
- Give space to settle your mind, prepare your hearts, and allow the Holy Spirit to begin to minister to you

SHALOM PRAYER MINISTRY INSTRUCTIONS:

1. As you begin the session, you will be asked:
 - Is it okay if we occasionally place our hands on you to pray for you?
 - (Please let us know if you are not comfortable with being touched)
 - Is there one part of the Godhead you are most comfortable with?
(Do you usually tend to pray to Jesus, Father God, or the Holy Spirit?)
2. Your main role today is to **RELAX & RECEIVE** from the Holy Spirit.
3. We are going to have **YOU ASK** Father God, Jesus, & the Holy Spirit some questions.
 - We will help form the questions for you, and you will repeat after us (out loud).
4. Then you will **REPORT BACK** what you are sensing, seeing, or hearing. (In response to the questions that you have asked)
 - **Whatever** the Holy Spirit reveals to you – please report that. Even if it doesn't make sense – He will tie it all together later
 - If you ask a question – and get nothing – **that is 100% normal**. When you don't get anything – it may be God telling us to go another way
 - If you get something you have already dealt with before, report it anyway; the Lord may want to reveal something else that came out of that situation.
 - It usually goes better if **you don't analyze** what He is showing you. **Let the Lord reveal** what exactly He is showing you – and why.
5. This is a **SAFE place** – all information shared is kept private.
 - We want you to feel free & open up to the Lord
 - This is **YOUR** time with **HIM**
6. We will ask you to **keep your eyes closed** – as much as possible.
 - This is so that you can keep focused on the Lord
 - If you need a break at anytime, just let us know
7. Summary: **RELAX**, **RECEIVE**, and **REPORT**

Biblical Meditation of Your Self Image

BE INFORMED BY | BE TRANSFORMED THROUGH | BE CONFORMED TO - HIS IMAGE

God is who He says He is; God will do what He says He will do; God's Word is forever settled in Heaven; when the word is established in my heart, it shall be manifested!

I am who God says I am; I am where God says I am; I have what God says I have; I can do what God says I can do (regardless of my feelings or appearances in the "natural")

Philemon 6: the communication of thy faith may become effectual (Divinely energized) by the acknowledging of every good thing, which is in you in Christ Jesus. (Already in you, but dormant – until acknowledged often)

Acknowledge the following often to establish the "inner reality" in your heart; then the "outer reality" (Manifestation) will come. The Holy Spirit (who is simultaneously inside and outside of you) will restructure "outer reality" to match the inner reality (according to the faith image held firmly inside).

I am who God says I am (I identify with Jesus)

- I am a new creation, born of God; therefore I overcome the world (2 Cor. 5:17; 1 John 5:4)
- I am redeemed from the curse, and the blessing of Abraham belongs to me (Gal. 3:13, 29; Deut. 28)
- I am accepted in the Beloved, and am a joint-heir with Christ (Eph. 1:6; Rom. 8:17)
- I am God's workmanship, wonderfully made in Christ Jesus (Eph. 2:10; Ps. 139:14)
- I am an overcomer, through the Blood of Jesus and the words of my testimony (Rev. 12:11)
- I am more than a conqueror through Christ who loves me (Rom. 8:37)
- I am strong in the Lord and in the Power of His Might (Eph. 6:10)
- As He (Jesus) is, so am I in this world (1 John 4:17)

I am where God says I am (I am where Jesus is, and Jesus is where I am)

- I am in the Kingdom of God (Light) and am completely out of the power of darkness (Col. 1:13) far above all principality and power; satan and his cohorts are all under my feet! (Eph. 1:21-23; Luke 10:19)
- I am in the Throne Room of God, I see people and circumstances from God's vantage point, and I think after God's Thoughts (Rom. 12:2)

I have what God says I have (all purchased by the blood of Jesus)

- I have received the gift of righteousness of God. This means that I have right standing with God, as well as rights and privileges in the Kingdom of God. (Rom. 5:17)
- I have received the PEACE of God that passes all understanding (Phil. 4:7)
- I have received the LOVE of God in my heart by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 5:5)
- I have the JOY of the Lord, which is my strength (Nehemiah 8:10)
- I have the FAITH of Jesus; all things are possible to me (Heb. 12:2; Mark 9:23) I have the AUTHORITY of Jesus over all the power of the enemy (Luke 10:19)
- I have the whole armor of God, and the armor of LIGHT (Eph. 6:13-18; Rom. 13:12)
- I have the WISDOM of God since I am filled with the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8)
- I have all the resources of God available to me (1 Cor. 3:21-23; 2 Peter 1:3)

I can do what God says I can do (by the POWER of the Holy Spirit dwelling in me)

- I can have what I say (if I doubt not) (Mark 11:23, 24; Matt. 9:29)
- I can love the unlovely and the unloving (Rom. 5:5; Gal. 5:6; 1 John 4:7, 16-19)
- I can rejoice in the Lord always (Phil. 4:4)
- I can obey God and offer the sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving, and joy even if I don't feel like it (Heb. 13:15; Ps. 107:22, 27:6)
- I can cast out demons and minister healing to the sick (Mark 16:17-18)
- I can do all things through him who strengthens me (Phil. 4:13)
- I can live the victorious, abundant LIFE God intended for me because JESUS is living BIG in me and through me (Col. 1:27, 2:3, 9; John 14:12-14, 15:4-8, 16:23-24; 1 John 4:4; Gal. 2:20; Rom. 8:31-32; 2 Cor. 1:20)

In Him I live, and move, and have my being (Acts 17:28); JESUS IS LORD!

THE PROMISE OF HOPE AND THE IMPORTANCE OF FINDING HOPE IN CHRIST

Psalms 43:5 Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

Psalms 119:74 May those who fear you rejoice when they see me, for I have put my hope in your word.

Psalms 130:7 O Israel, put your hope in the LORD, for with the LORD is unfailing love and with him is full redemption.

Proverbs 10:28 The prospect of the righteous is joy, but the hopes of the wicked come to nothing.

Jeremiah 17:7 But blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in Him.

Romans 5:1-5 Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have [a] peace with God through our LORD Jesus Christ through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance character, and character, hope. And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, who he has given us.

Ephesians 1:18 I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints.

Colossians 1:26-27 The mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generation, but is now disclosed to the saints. To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.

Hebrews 6:10-11 God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you helped his people and continue to help them. We want each of you to show this same diligence to the very end, in order to make your hope sure.

Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.

1 Peter 1:3 Praise be to the God and Father of our LORD Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

1 Peter 1:21 Through him you believe in God, who raised him from the dead and glorified him, and so your faith and hope are in God.

1 Peter 3:15 But in your hearts set apart Christ as LORD. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect.

SPM SESSION AFTER CARE

Any spirits that have troubled you in the past (pre-session), will likely try to trouble you in the near future with the same thoughts, feelings and things you found yourself saying and/or doing. They will “revisit” you in familiar ways to try to make you think the healing, cleansing, and revelation the Lord gave you didn’t really change anything.

If this happens, you will need to stand against those old familiar ways of “reacting to life,” and determine to hold on to what the Lord has done for you by refusing to accept the negative thoughts, emotions, and actions as being your own; and at the same time, take “possession” by proclaiming the positive things you are and will do from now on (That is the God given replacements you have received from Him). These include the truths He gave you to replace the lies (e.g. “I no longer have a problem of fear, anger, etc.I receive and walk in courage and peace”).

There is great divine power in agreement with God according to His word and what He has accomplished in you through the SPM session. You are, literally, engaging with God in the creative work He has done in and for you by agreeing with Him and further proclaiming it as who you are (Mark 11:23-24, and Job 22:28)

Refuse to allow the enemy of your soul to steal God’s blessings from you or cause you to give it away because of old patterns of behaviors being repeated. The enemy will eventually give up if you hold your ground.

Simple ways to detox our emotions:

Confession, forgiveness and Emotional exchange

At the end of every day, you can ask the lord to highlight the negative emotions that you felt throughout the day. Here are the steps you can follow to release the emotions and receive peace from God.

- 1) **Get into the presence of God** by inviting the Father to fill you with the love of God through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 2) **Bring that negative emotion to the Lord** and ask the Lord for the root cause.
 - a) If there is unconfessed sins in your heart, then confess your sins before the Lord.
 - b) If people have offended you, then extend forgiveness to those individuals.
- 3) **Release those toxic emotions to the Lord.** Using words and imagery, submit them to God.
- 4) **Ask the Lord for an exchange at the cross.** Listen for what He has in exchange.
- 5) **Marinate in that promise** and pray that blessing into your life.

Be encouraged to trust God that you will continue to grow in the Blessings that He has given you. You honor Him by the simple act of agreeing with Him, according to His word and what He has done in and for you.

At first it may seem like a challenge. As you experience newfound freedom, you will be encouraged to continue to hold the ground you have been given. Remember to keep thanking God for the blessings of change He has given you. As you rehearse it in thanksgiving, it will become centered in who you are (See Mark 11:23 – “He will have whatever he says”).
